During all the ages of human history, tribes and nations have had their sages, philosophers, friends of wisdom. Indeed, wisdom, insight, sound judgment is a precious possession. But human wisdom is not always adequately the same as truth. Often sages have narrowed their observation by working with their intellect alone. This resulted in all forms of rationalism which had no eye for the transcendent. In the Bible we find a type of wisdom which originates from both heart and intellect. It is an often-intuitive wisdom of the total person. Moreover, Biblical wisdom is a special gift of God. That is why we pay attention to it. In today's Bible readings, wisdom is considered the supreme value of human life, and the parables of the treasure and the pearl bring out that the kingdom of God is a value for which no sacrifice is too great. It is a question of priority of values! Wise and mature Christians have a sound judgment about what is more or less important in life, since they blend human insight with the God-inspired wisdom of the Bible.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

* What is the wisest person you`ve known, and how was that wisdom demonstrated?

* When has a difficult hour led you to a blessing you did not expect?

* How much have you wagered for the kingdom of God so far?

*Question of the week: Is your treasure invested in the wisdom of the world or in the wisdom of God?

How has your understanding of Eucharist evolved with the number of times you`ve approached the Lord`s Table?

- How does the reality of what we celebrate in the Eucharist bind all of us together, even those who do not receive it?
- How do you bring the fragments of Eucharist to others so that nothing may be wasted?

Faith Response

Pray for the wisdom of an understanding heart. Ask God to give you the ability to know the difference between good and evil, between what is valuable and what is useless.

The parable of the net has same message as that of the wheat and the weeds. In its present stage, the kingdom contains both good and bad things. Only at the final judgment will they be separated.

AND MAY YOU, LORD, GIVE US THE WISDOM TO KNOW WHAT TO KEEP AND WHAT TO THROW AWAY.
