The "I am better than you" syndrome is part of the human condition. Collectively, it appears as triumphalism in religion. The evil of triumphalism has stained the Church for many centuries. Let us humbly admit it. If a certain kind of triumphalism would have been confined to "Jesus Christ and his abundant love for us is unsurpassed," it would have been all right. But often the beauty, truth, and riches of the Catholic Faith were identified with its proud sharers, and resulted in that ominous "we are right and you are wrong" complex which has caused so much damaging alienation. Belonging to God's chosen people does not mean that we are necessarily Bible readings suggest an openness in love and respect for others, as taught in the contemporary setting by the Council's Decree on Ecumenism. "Almighty God, your care extends beyond the boundaries of race and nation to the hearts of all who live. May the walls, which prejudice raises, between us, crumble beneath the shadow of your outstretched arm. better than people who following their own conscience seek God in a different way.
